AASHTO Staff Updates



- **AASHTOWare Director Change**

- Jan Edwards retired from AASHTO on January 3rd
 - 32 years with AASHTO
 - Oversaw the evolution and growth of AASHTOWare
- Keith Platte promoted to AASHTOWare Director
 - Came to AASHTO from Michigan DOT in 2006
 - Focus on strategic and long range planning for all of AASHTOWare
 - Signification reduction in AASHTOWare Project involvement

Estimation Summit

General Updates



- **Catalog/License updates for FY23**
 - 5% license fee increases in FY23 (July 2022)
 - No increase in FY22
 - ForneyVault® Software Offering
 - Machine-integrated, cloud-based construction materials testing platform
 - Working on production ready Interface with AASHTOWare Project
 - Sample and testing data exchange between the two systems
 - No cost Estimation license with paid Estimator license
 - Intended to help agencies implement Estimation
 - Maximum 2 year overlap
 - EUD Notice scheduled for February with more detail
- **Support Changes**
 - Customer Support hours extended as of January 18th
 - Support through 5pm Pacific / 4pm Alaskan
 - Clarification of support covered with license fees
 - Provide examples of what is covered
 - Supplemental Support from Infotech
 - EUD Notice will provide more information

Joint Funding



- Why it's important?
 - Growth: Our product is growing along with varying needs of each agency
 - Enhancement: Working together produces a higher number of enhancements to the software
- What TMRs to fund?
 - Top 3: The top 3 TMRs across the 12 categories of the 2021 PUG Ballot
 - PTF Focus: The top 3 TMRs in each category help us understand where there is the most interest and need from the agencies
- When should we act?
 - Now is the time: The PTF wants to work with agencies now to jointly fund the top 3 TMRs from the 2021 PUG Ballot



Project Development Today

- Web-Based AASHTOWare Project
 - Waterfall
 - Linear phases, build on deliverables from previous phase
 - Requirements > Design > Development > Alpha > Beta > Release
- SaaS AASHTOWare Project Data Analytics
 - Agile Approach
 - Small features developed and released every 2 weeks
 - TRT tests new features in a production ready environment
 - Feedback incorporated immediately
- We have learned a lot about Agile Development
 - Interest in Agile development for web-based AASHTOWare Project

- Hybrid Agile
 - Variation on Agile
 - Need to Account for variation in AASHTO / Joint Development
 - Hybrid Agile AASHTO Standard Available
 - https://www.aashtoware.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/11/SG_Notebook_11012021.pdf
- Benefits
 - Reduced time and cost of development
 - Prioritized features delivered faster
 - Improved quality of software
 - Improve AASHTOWare's competitive position

What is Hybrid Agile?

- Agile Software Development
 - **Working software** over comprehensive document
 - **Responding to change** over following a plan
 - **Customer collaboration** over contract negotiation
 - **Individuals and interactions** over processes and tools
 - Working software is primary measure of progress
- Approach
 - 2 week Sprints
 - Production ready features software delivered rapidly
 - Continuous testing by users
 - Feedback loop
 - Focus on Minimum Viable Product (MVP)

Agile Changes Everything!

- Impacts of moving to Hybrid Agile
 - Development process changes
 - TRT/FPG process and makeup changes
 - New “Hybrid Agile Team” approach
 - **Suggestion:** PUG Ballot alignment with Agile
 - Benefit in dynamic and evolving priority
 - Release Testing changes
 - Focus on continuous user and automated testing

Not If But When

- The PTF plans to implement Hybrid Agile
 - “Agile” Agile Approach
 - Process will change based on lessons learned
- Target Hybrid Agile for 4.9/4.10 releases
 - Continue with 6-month production release cadence
- What's next
 - Finalize processes
 - Develop training materials
 - Communicate plan
 - Train Business Stakeholders
 - Initiate Hybrid Agile Development
 - Update process based on lessons learned
